Travel to Boston

Air Transportation. Travelers should fly to Boston Logan Airport. The Airport is about four miles from the hotel. The hotel does not offer shuttle service. Listed below are options. However, the hotel website gives some great local transportation tools to plan your itinerary.

Subway.

Travelers can use the Boston Subway system to get to the airport. Cost each way \$2.00 and about a 1 hour trip. Directions are Take Silver Line South from Terminal Arrive at So. Station Silver Line, switch to Red Line/Alewife Station and take to Downtown Crossing. At Downtown Crossing Switch to Orange Line/Forest Hills and get off at the Boston Back Bay Station. Hotel is next to the station.

Taxi cost from the airport is 35.00.

Driving/Rental Cars. Airport offers rental car services.

Parking at the Hotel is 44.00 per day.

Train/AMTRAK. Amtrak Services South Station Boston with easy. Service. South Station is with easy access to Boston Subway system \$1.60 and 15 minute ride to Back Bay Station using the Framington Worcester Line.

Army Planning Symposium & Federal Planning Training Workshop

In these times of tight resources what is the value of my agency participating the the Army Planning Symposium and the Federal Planning Division Workshop?

The Army as well as all Federal Agencies are being required to develop their properties in a sustainable, energy effective manner. ASHRAE 189.1 standards are requiring compliance with compact mixed-use development. This annual conference is the most cost effective means to identify best practices to meet our agency's Federal directives and guidance. The cost of the Army Planning Symposium is free, except for travel expenses.

Why is the Army Planning Symposium being held in conjunction with Federal Planning Division and the American Planning Association.

In regards to hosting a conference, and getting the best and brightest in the planing profession, the synergy of having the entire planning community from the Army, Navy, Air Force, OSD and the other Federal agencies is the most effective value to learn and share best business practices. There is no more efficient way to bring our Nation's leading experts in planning to one location.

What is the best advice for making traveling plans to Boston?

Boston is a very large city and using public transportation is the best mode to getting to the hotel. First, we recommend that you reserve your hotel reservation at the host hotel early. Then, either use the subway or taxi to get to the hotel. The hotel is located at a subway station and cost is at worse case 2.00 one way. The Taxi rate is around 35.00. The Hotel does not have a airport shuttle. The hotel is located in one of the greatest neighborhoods of Boston so there are more than a number of activities for restaurants. Limited rooms at the hotel is 190.00 which is per diem. So register quickly.

Do I get credit for American Institute of Community Planners maintenance education units?

Yes, all breakout sessions are approved by the AICP for continuation education maintenance credits.

What is the weather for Boston for this time of year?

For the beginning of April average high is 53 degrees and low is 37 degrees. Average temperate of 45 degrees. Workshops will require walking so participants should plan on packing a nice warm coat.
